Foundation in 1977

The NY Metropolitan (NY Metro) Chapter was founded in 1977, five years after the KSEA was founded. Fifty-two scientists and engineers attended the inaugural meeting at SamBogJeong Korean restaurant in Manhattan on March 5, 1977. The first chapter president (CP) was late Dr. Chong- Whan Kim who worked at Schering at that time. The Council consisted of 10 councilors at the beginning and later expanded to have 22. NY Metro produced four KSEA HQ presidents who are Drs. Chin Ok Lee (president in 1989-1990), Sung-Kwon Kang (2006-2007), Kang-Wook Lee (2008-2009), and Myung Jong Lee (2013-2014).

First Student in NY: Esther Pak in 1895

Esther Kim Pak had lived in Liberty, NY and NY City from Jan 1895 to Oct 1896 when she entered

the Baltimore Women's Medical College. She studied at Liberty Public School from Feb 1895 for a semester. For the next one year she studied high school courses through private lessons while working at NYC Nursery and Child's Hospital to make ends meet. Her maiden name was Chyom Tong Kim (김점동) who graduated from Ewha Hakdang (이화학당) in early 1890's. And she received a MD degree in 1900. She was the first woman medical doctor in Korea.

Social Activities

The major activities in early years involved social activities such as dinner parties, tennis tournaments, and golf outings. Annual dinner or award parties were held usually in Jan or Feb. It was often called "구정의 밤" since we celebrated the Lunar New Year. The annual awards had discontinued since early 2000's.

Golf outing has been a popular social activity and it is often organized on the same day as General Assembly or as part of a farewell party when a dedicated member moves to Korea or a different city. Tennis tournaments also used to be held on the same day as General Assembly in which CP, vice CPs, councilors and auditors are elected. SIT was the most favorite venue as Dr. Sunghoon Kim had organized the event many times from his student days.

Annual Fall Picnic (1981- present)

Fall picnic with undergraduate and graduate students started in 1981 under the leadership of the 6th CP, Dr. Sung-Kwon Kang. In the first few years, the students at the Stevens Institute of Technology played a major role in its sports activities. The participating schools for the last several years include Columbia, NYU Polytech, NJIT, CUNY, and Queens College.

Northeast Regional Conference (1988-present; the 22nd NRC was held in 2013)

In the early years the major activities involved social meetings and picnics with the families and the graduate students from Korea. Then it started organizing invited talks and symposiums. From the end of the 1980s NY Metro organized its own symposiums while the neighboring chapters of NJ, Lehigh Valley and Philadelphia held their first regional conference in 1988. Starting in 1992, the four chapters had organized the conference which was named "the 3rd Northeast Regional Conference, the abbreviation of which was made "NRC" from 1995 when it was expanded to 2 days. NRC1995 had 91 papers. Since 2005, the three organizations NY Metro, NJ, and KASBP (Korean American Society in Biotech and Pharmaceuticals) co-hosted it. The 22nd NRC was held in June 2013.

Young-generation special programs had been organized as part of the NRC a few times in late 1990's and a few times recently. It is noteworthy that the 1997 YG program was sponsored by the Korea-US Science Cooperation Center (KUSCO). NRC YG Program in 1997 was the very first event among KUSCO's funding for YG activities.

Math and Science Olympiad (1994-present)

KSEA NY Metro Math and Science Olympiad (KMSO) became the most important and meaningful chapter activity. It is meaningful since it is a unique volunteer service to the Korean-American community.

It was an extremely tough project to the chapter specially at the beginning since we needed to develop a good overall program, to raise an enough fund, to recruit dedicated members and to advertise it to the Korean community. The idea was conceived in early 1994 mainly by three members: immediate ex-CP Yeon-Tae Jung, CP Myung Jong Lee and elected-CP Kang-Wook Lee. Its preparation began on July 1, 1994 under the leadership of the new CP, Kang-Wook Lee. The first KMSO had the following program and committees.

- (1) Date: November 19, 1994
- (2) Venue: Bronx High School of Science

(3) Purpose in program: To inform the young generation Korean-American students of the importance of math and science to their education

and careers, to provide their parents with the information about children's education, and to demonstrate the modern sciences and technologies. (4) Program: (a) math test, (b) science exhibitions, and (c) lectures for parents.

It turned out a huge success. The total attendance was over 1,000. The NY Korea Times selected KMSO as one of the top 10 Korean-American community events.

The science part started with science/technology exhibits and then changed to science competition that involves test, project, and poster. KMSO was organized by NY Metro from 1994 to 2002, co-organized by NY Metro and NJ from 2003 to 2006, and then organized only by NY Metro from 2007. KMSO was the first math AND science competition event in the history of KSEA. It is noted that KSEA HQ started Math Competition from 2002 and Math/Science Competitions (NMSC)

from 2007 and that NJ has held NMSC in April as part of KSEA HQ since 2008.

NY Metro has held the annual Math and Science Olympiad (KMSO) every year since its inauguration in 1994. The dedicated efforts of officers, ex-officers, and ex-CPs made such sustained volunteer activities possible for 22 straight years. KMSO has been recognized as one of the best volunteer activities for the Great NY Korean Community. Other key activities such as Northeast Regional Conferences and fall picnics are also well sustained.
